Director Casey also presented her budget request listing the increases she feels are needed to cover the upcoming Presidential election and the extra costs associated with it.

The Commissioners stated they would review with the budget, speak with the Auditor and have a discussion with her at a later date regarding this matter.

Dennis & Mary Jean Reinhart were present to discuss the opportunity of establishing a park district within Jackson County. Mr. Reinhart stated this has been discussed before, but there has been a change he wanted to make the Commissioners aware of. The Nature Conservancy does mediation work, and it is possible for Jackson County to obtain 130+ acres in the extreme southwest of the county, after the land has been rehabilitated and restored by the Nature Conservancy in approximately two years. It is presently a cattle farm off of Five Points Rd. Mr. Rinehart has been in discussion with Ross County and Ohio Parks Recreation Groups, who stated they would help Jackson County develop quality outdoor recreation. This could be beneficial to kids who have to do community service through school and also help jail inmates learn skills. Mr. Rinehart also wants a park devoted to handicap accessible. Most park assistance comes from park system grants, which there are different ones available. Jackson County is the only county without a park's district board. Ohio Revised Code 15-45 governs use of county park districts.
