Ms. Smith stated that the Ohio Department of Job & Family Services is making funding available to assist low-income families and some elderly and disabled individuals. JFS has requested to receive \$200,000 in TANF PRC funds and \$25,000 Adult Non-TANF funds, the maximum allowed for each category. Waiting on updates and verification of this request. Regarding the replacement of electronically stolen SNAP benefits, there has been an extension of the Continuing Appropriations and Extensions Act through December 20, 2024.

As a result of a few lateral transfers and promotions, 40% of the agency's Children Services positions are vacant. They are in the process of interviewing.

JFS executive leadership team, along with Mobility Manager Lissa Warrens, met last week with the Ohio Department of Transportation and Nelson Nygaard to move forward with the Transportation Development Plan. In the upcoming weeks, they will organize a Transit Working Group that will establish Transit services here in Jackson County.

Dr. Marla Haller, DO, FAPWCA, CMD and Sandra Dehart, LPN, Nurse Administrator (Holzer Health Systems) were present to recognize breast cancer awareness month. Dr. Haller read the proclamation, with the theme "No One Should Face Breast Cancer Alone – Close the Care Gap". This year it is estimated that more than 310,720 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer and more than 42,250 will die of the disease in 2024. In addition, an estimated 2790 men are expected to be diagnosed and 530 will die of the disease.
